ShelterBox Responding to Flooding in Pakistan

Severe monsoon flooding has caused widespread devastation across Pakistan, destroying homes and sweeping away entire villages. Pakistan's monsoon season always brings heavy rain, but this year's storms have been unusually intense. Rare cloudbursts – sudden downpours dumping over 4 inches of rain in just one hour – have triggered flash floods in the northwest, sweeping through mountain villages and causing widespread destruction.

Homes have been crushed by floodwater and landslides. People have described watching everything they own being washed away or buried. "The intensity and speed of the monsoon rains caught people off guard – destroying homes and sweeping away entire villages. People are in urgent need of support." – Haroon Altaf, ShelterBox Regional Director of Asia & MENA





ShelterBox has a team in Pakistan, and we're sending another team to Islamabad in the coming days. We will be working closely with Islamic Relief Pakistan (IRP) on how best to support people displaced by flooding and landslides.

We're getting ready to respond with emergency shelter, which families urgently need. We have shelter and other essential items available in Pakistan and Dubai, so we're ready to respond quickly, given how vulnerable the country is to extreme weather and other disasters.

We'll be looking at shelter repair kits, which include tarpaulins and rope, so people can make temporary repairs to damaged homes. People also need items such as water filters, water carriers, and mosquito nets, especially with the increased risk of disease after flooding. August – November is the season for dengue and malaria in these areas.

ShelterBox has responded to flooding in Pakistan before—most recently in 2022—supporting families with tents, water filters, mosquito nets, solar lights, and other essential supplies.

As you know, ShelterBox is Rotary's Project Partner in disaster relief working to ensure that no family is left without shelter. With the ongoing support of Rotary Club's and Districts across the US, we can make a difference.

Former Rotary Exchange Student Looking to Reconnect

Hello, my name is Sandra King and I did a Rotary exchange (in Chambersburg) with Ellie Frey a mere 46 years ago! I have lost touch with Ellie but I thought your club might like to know that I joined The Rotary Club of St Ives in Cambridgeshire, England, 8 years ago, and have just become their President.

I attach photos of Ellie and the Frey family from all those year ago, and one of myself at handover. Mervin Frey was a Chambersburg Rotarian and stockbroker, and his wife Margaret was a School Psychologist. They lived in Woodland Way, Guilford Hills. John Hornbaker was the Rotary Youth Exchange Officer for your club.

I still have the hand-written speech that was my post-exchange report to Hove Rotary Club, where my Dad Alan Raggett was a Rotarian, along with 4 photo albums of faded pictures, memorabilia and hand-written commentary.

Since that time I have had a successful career in sport; firstly as a Physical Education (PE) Teacher in mainstream schools, and later working with students with high levels of physical disability. This led to my involvement in disability sport, particularly Boccia, and thus to coach the England Team and get involved with the Paralympic movement. I organised the Boccia competition as part of the London2012 Paralympics. More recently I have been tutoring courses around disability sport and inclusive PE, but have now retired.
